She is able to utilise her experience of international children law effectively to assist her clients with the issues which often arise in this complex area.

International Children Law

Indu is highly experienced within the field of International Children law and is a specialist international children barrister. She regularly appears in the High Court in cases involving the abduction of a child under the 1980 Hague Convention. She has a very busy practice in this area.

Indu also has experience of abduction cases where there have been linked asylum proceedings. Indu is also experienced in International children cases under the Inherent Jurisdiction.

She has also appeared as junior counsel in the Court of Appeal in International children cases which have involved issues such as setting aside Return Orders made under 1980 Hague Convention, and cases involving the separate representation of children in 1980 Hague Convention proceedings.
